Ngati Kahungunu and Cape Kidnappers access (NK/CK)

Process

- NZWAC to meet with both parties individually to discuss expectations
- Draft agenda (on advice from NK and CK) for a joint meeting

- Set up and chair initial meeting
- Establish a watching brief to ensure momentum is not lost

01 June 2018 Call from Mike Holm who has unearthed the CK/NK access agreement signed on behalf of s 9(2)(a) CK by farm manager and Ngahiwi Tomoana, Chair NK and Mike Paku. NZWAC will deal with CK CEO Euan Taylor (an Englishman). The Commission to keep Mike Holm informed.

6 June 2018 Met with Euan Taylor CEO and Paul Saunders CFO. They are happy with the original access agreement and are willing to meet Ngati Kahungunu. NZWAC to arrange the meeting with Ngahiwi

28 June 2018 Met with Ngahiwi and updated him on our contact with CK, including that they have unearthed the original access agreement and their willingness to meet. Ngahiwi agreed to a meeting which NZWAC will set up. Showed Ngahiwi the [process](#) which we hope to follow and he was happy with it, given that if they follow the original agreement much of the items for negotiation will be covered off.

19 July 2018 Meeting with Euan Taylor, Paul Sanders CK, Ngahiwi NK and NZWAC. [Meeting notes here](#). Agreed to resurrect the original [signed agreement](#) with no changes. NK will welcome CK staff onto their Marae and introduce them to the history and story of Cape Kidnappers, Te Kauae a Maui. This would be followed at a later date with a hikoi onto the cape. NZWAC will be invited to join the home people.

25 July 2018 [Email](#) from Euan Taylor following hui. *'We talked of arranging a follow up meeting in early October to introduce our Lodge Managers s 9(2)(a). At this time we can plan for some cultural & heritage training on our region for our staff to take place in November.'*

He also explained efforts to encourage Māori pupils to engage in science and understanding their local environment.

There was discussion on their special places with Cape Kidnappers highlighted. There was an access arrangement with the USA owner s 9(2)(a) but since his son has taken over access is now denied.

Meeting with Ngati Kahungunu (NK) and Cape Kidnappers (CK)

Prior to the meeting Euan had forwarded the original signed agreement between Ngahiwi and s 9(2)(a) . Both parties agreed it was still relevant, no changes were required and they were happy to resurrect it.
