Te Henui Walkway is one of the most beautiful walkways in New Plymouth District, which winds its way up from the coast through a variety of native and exotic flora, past historical pā sites, and several picnic areas and swimming holes. It is also the access point to the coveted gardens of Te Henui Cemetery.

There are many access points for this walkway, which is wheelchair and pram-friendly, and is perfectly suitable for all abilities. It is also a popular bike path, with many cyclists also utilising the beautiful track.

To complete the whole walk, begin from the Te Henui Bridge (or the 'lightning bolt' bridge as locals call it) on the New Plymouth Coastal Walkway at the East End Reserve, at the eastern end of Buller Street.

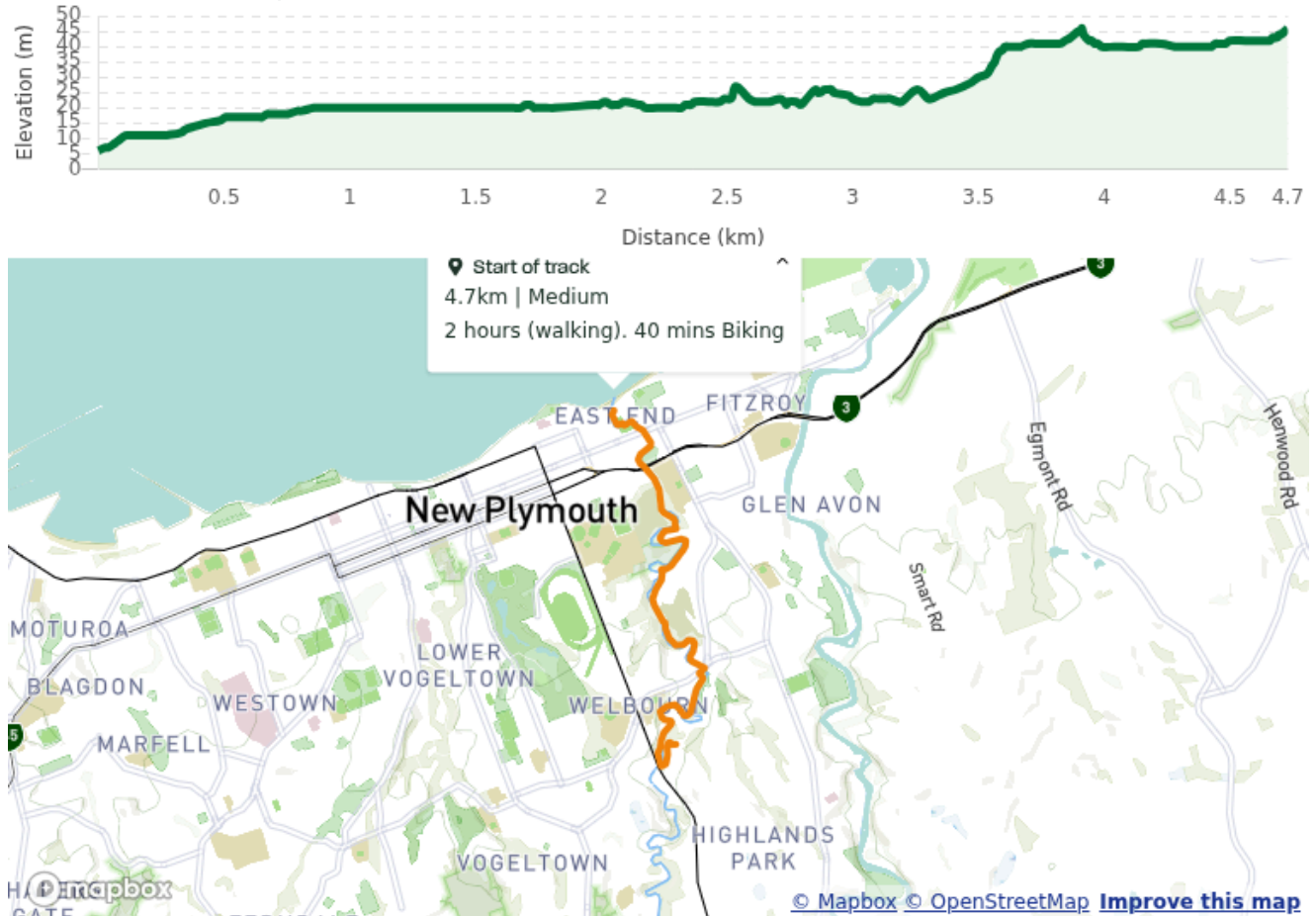
