This loop walk along existing roads starts in the centre of Inglewood. The all-weather path is safe for cyclists, walkers, runners and people with dogs and pushchairs.

Start and finish at Caffe Windsor on the corner of Matai Street and Kelly Street East, where you can pick up a map.

Heading clockwise, follow the main road, turning right along Dudley Road Upper.

Follow along until you reach the right-hand turn for Windsor Road, which later becomes Miro Street.

Another right turn will bring you back to Kelly Street East.

Work commenced on the walkway in 2010. In 2011, stage two saw its popularity grow, and now the completed walkway is a favourite for the people of Inglewood and, increasingly, people from the Taranaki region and beyond.

Taranaki Electricity Trust and New Plymouth District Council jointly funded the Windsor Walkway project.

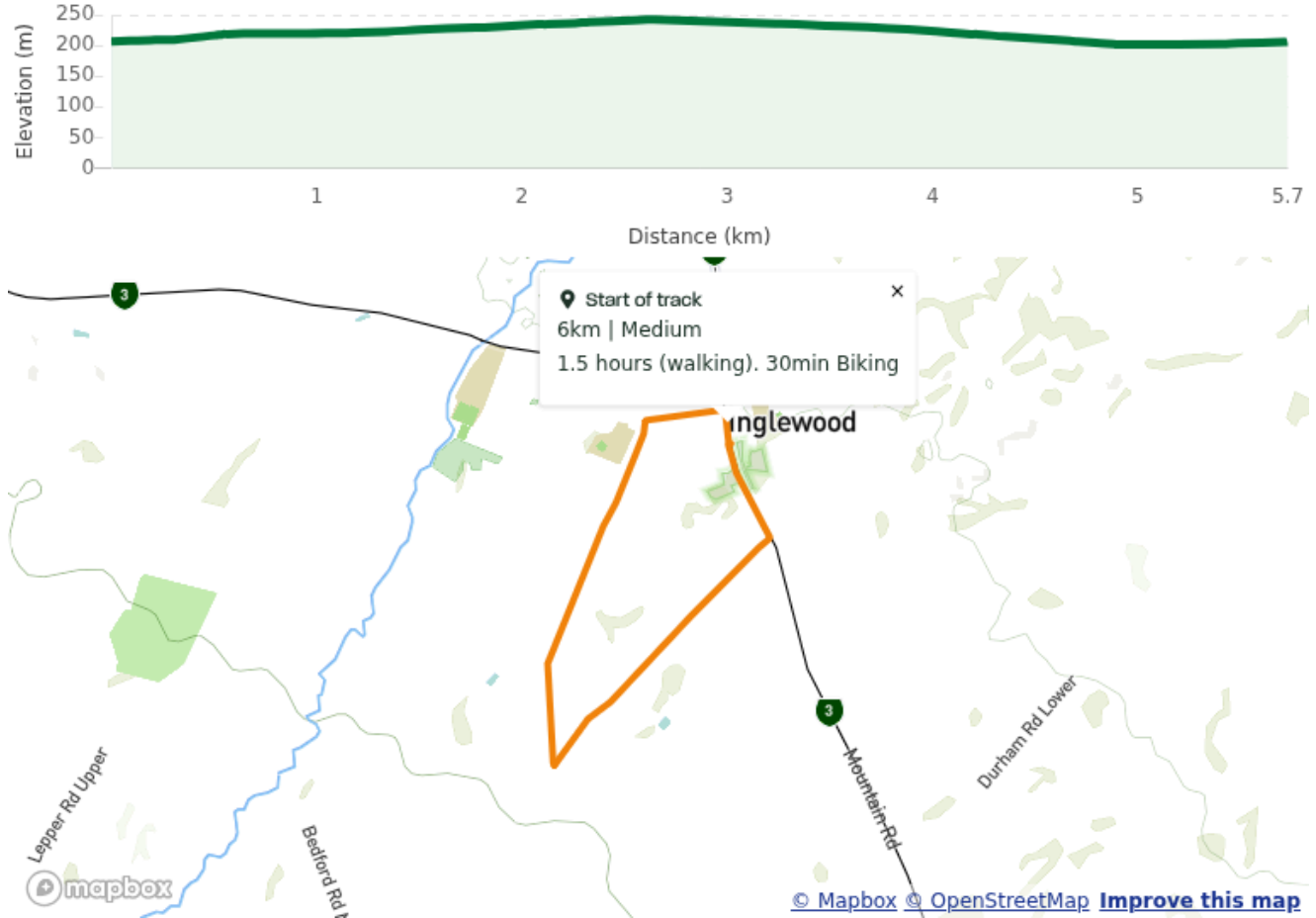
Start and finish at Caffe Windsor on the corner of Matai Street and Kelly Street East, Inglewood.
